Malachi tells of a fierce day that will burn away the wicked, but for those who fear the Lord, healing will come like the sun rising. Psalm 98 invites us to sing with joy because God rules with justice and fairness. His rule brings hope to all who long for peace.

**Story:** The 2025 United Nations Climate Change Conference, known as COP30, will be held in Belém, Brazil, from 10th to 21st November.


**Question:** What would you tell world leaders if you were at COP30?

Chikondi the Giraffe: Thinking of everyone (The Common Good)

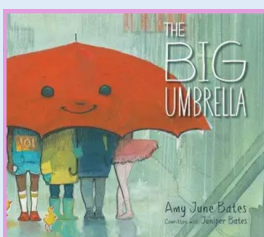
Shristi the Sun bear: Showing we care (Generosity)
